An intimate tale about the mass extinction of species, ARC invites audiences to get up close and personal with snow leopards, hammerhead sharks, microbats, elephants, and other vulnerable species. The performance explores the natural world of feathered, furry, and smooth-skinned friends that co-habit the planet. It raises questions about our relationship with the changing natural environment, our vulnerability as a race and the fragility of the eco-sphere.

Erth have been creating innovative physical and visual theatre for over 30 years and know how to engage children. Their beautiful life-size puppets are an incredible tool to shine a light on science, sustainability, current affairs and our planet, providing children a different pathway to ask questions about their world. It is a visual feast, with poetic narration, dynamic performances, original music and projection, that address many of the Arts syllabus priorities. With curriculum links to family relationships, loss and grief, storytelling, climate action and biological species, this production will entertain and educate children and ultimately leave them with hope.

Diane Wolfer's beloved 'Lighthouse Girl' is being brought to the stage and screen at BREC. The team that brought 'A Fortunate Life' to BREC for sold out shows in 2023, are back with their unique blend of archival and moving image film projection, live performance, soundscapes and original music. Audiences travel with the first Australian Imperial Force convoy as it embarks from Albany and arrives in Gallipoli. We follow the characters' journey from trenches at the Western Front to hospitals in rural England and eventual homecoming to Australia.

The teenage protagonist is based on Fay Howe who lived at the lighthouse on Breaksea Island. The island was the last point of Australia soldiers would see on their journey to war, and many felt the need to send a last message to loved ones left behind. Skilled in telegraphy, Fay became their messenger. Fay's story embodies the strength, resilience, and resourcefulness of the women left behind by a generation of men. This production engages with key curriculum priorities of personal and community stories as well as addressing the English strands of language, literature and literacy.
