### Welcome!

We hope that this guide helps you to make decisions about the best events for your family to attend at the 2024 AWESOME Festival.

Our goal in creating this guide is to provide extra support, catering to the needs of all our bright young things. We have gathered information about all of our events within the festival program and listed any positive and negative triggers that could be of attention in providing the most comfortable, joyful experience for all.

Ultimately, it is parents and carers who are best placed to understand their child's needs and responses. This guide aims to support you in these decisions.

**Using this Guide:** Within the guide you will find a rating grid at the bottom of each page. We encourage parents and carers to utilise the grid to measure the difficulty of each activity between 1 and 5 (1 being 'easy peasy' and 5 being 'extremely difficult'). This may assist in making decisions about what to see and do, appropriate to the individual needs of your child.

Companion Cards: If you hold a companion card, you are entitled to one free admission along with a paid ticket to all of our events. **Our Team:** If you find yourself in need of assistance, please feel confident to approach one of our team (wearing an AWESOME Festival t-shirt or pink volunteer vest).

It may be something as simple as needing to get into a venue early, ensuring that you get seating that is appropriate, assistance leaving a venue during a show or finding a quiet spot to chill out. To make it easy, all you need to do is approach a team member and say that you have a child with additional needs. Our team will assist you in any way that they can.

**Quiet Zones:** Sometimes the Festival 'vibe' can be overwhelming or over-stimulating for children and you just need somewhere quiet to wind down. For those who need some time away, some suggested quiet zones on the festival site:

- State Library of WA, Story Place, Mezzanine Level (access via lift/stairs)
- Urban Orchard (outdoors, opposite the Art Gallery of WA)
- State Theatre Centre, Heath Ledger Theatre foyer, Level 2 (behind alcove)

#### **Parking Offer:**

Thanks to City of Perth Parking, you can get **5 hours of parking for \$9** if you park at the State Library or Cultural Centre CPP car parks between Tuesday 24 - Saturday 28 September.

To redeem this offer, simply validate your parking ticket at the AWESOME Information Booth at the State Theatre Centre of WA (open from 9:30am - 3pm daily). Normal rates apply after 5-hours.



### 2 Blair Street, Bunbury WA 6230

**Entrance:** Main entrance through glass doors. Box office entrance through automatic doors.

**Lifts:** Lift access available.

**Toilets:** Toilets are located on all levels. The Cube toilets are signed clearly and accessible toilets / ambulant toilets are available. They are located down a short corridor to your immediate left if exiting from the Lift or down the short corridor immediately in front of you as you come up the stairs to our Sky Bar / Cube Theatre area.

**Drop off point:** There is drop off availability for people if they want to pull up directly out the front of the venue. They simply need to pull over and turn on their hazard lights while disembarking from vehicles and can then move off to find a suitable car park.

**Parking:** There are two carparks at the front of the BREC building.

- Entering from Clifton St there are two ACROD bays by the front of BREC Box Office.
- Entering from Symmons Street, there are five ACROD bays close to the building.




