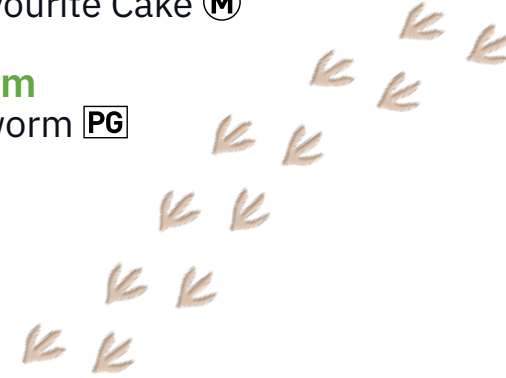

Once news of their nuptials reaches Russia, her fairytale is threatened as the parents set out for New York to get the marriage annulled by any means necessary.

Winner of Cannes Un Certain Regard, this is a compelling tale of redemption.
