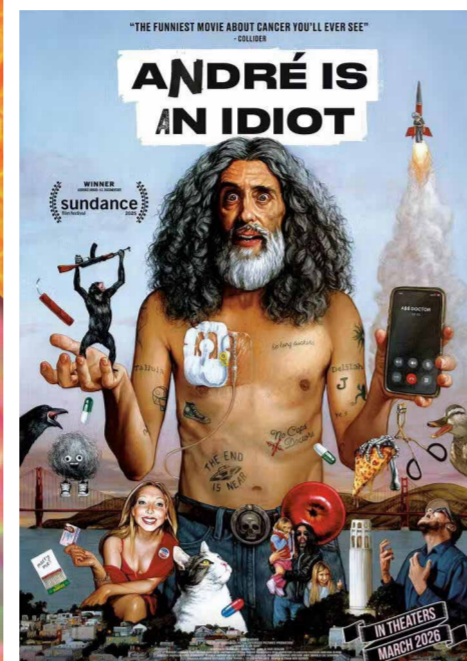


All That's Left of You ^M

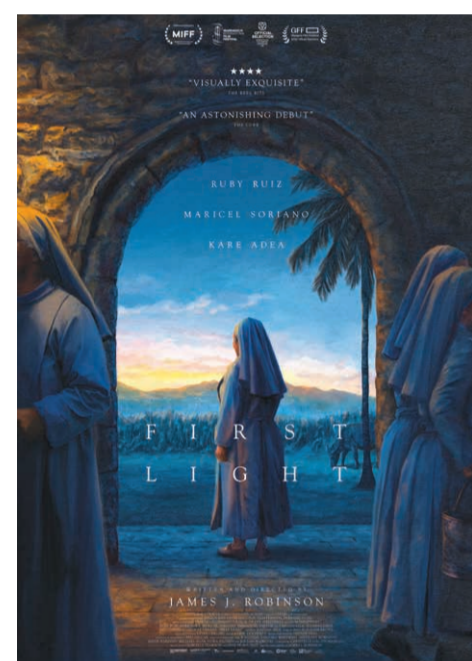
